It is with great excitement that we are announcing the 10th Summer **Fine Arts & Sciences Day Camp**. Much creative planning has been put into place. The children can experience six weeks of the arts. We are inviting ladies and gentlemen ages 3-10 years to come share their summer with us. There will be younger and older groups for camp.

The children may enroll for the entire 6 week program or individual weeks of interest. The tuition covers all materials for the different camp programs, art supplies, and your child's field trip to an art museum, visitors and guest speakers to our camp. **You can register your child via sending back this form on or before May 15th or by attending our Summer Camp Open House on April 17th and May 15th (non-LMMA families).** Please call ahead for an appointment.

If you are planning on attending the Open House, please bring with you this registration form and the tuition payment for the weeks your child will be attending. If you have friends or neighbors who would like the camp information just let us know. Very soon our school will be mailing the Summer Day Camp brochure to over 7,000 families. June 14 – June 18: Adventures in Music: Ages 3-5

Archaeology & Anthropology: Ages 6-10

Adventures in Music through Movement! Julie Troum, our Music Specialist, will journey with the campers through movement. They will experience the elements of rhythm, melody, fun props and hands on instruments. They will swirl, giggle, jive and dance. We will culminate the week with a "Family Performance" showcasing our growth in musical expression and understanding.

Archaeology and Anthropology: Native Tribes of North American Campers will study explorers such as, Davy Crockett, Lewis and Clark, and Johnny Appleseed. They will explore Native American Tribes, Sacagawea and the impact they had on our nation's history. We will spend a day on the Oregon Trail, create Native American art, and develop an understanding of the geography of the United States. An Orlando Historical Society member will visit us dressed as an early settler.

June 21 – June 25: Children's Books Come to Life! Ages 3-5

Let's Make Music! Ages 6-10

Children's Books Come to Life: Works of children's favorites Eric Carle and Dr. Seuss will be brought to life with art projects, drama, puppets and science lessons. We will create a complete class book ready for publishing, complete with original illustrations and writing. A member from the Orlando Historical Society will visit the class dressed as a non-fictional character.

Let's Make Music: Campers will explore the world of music ensembles. They will receive music training in the percussion techniques, rhythm patterns and reading of music notes. We will sing and make music with a beautiful assortment of Orff instruments. A few musicians will drop by to sing and play for us. Music and melody will permeate the classroom at our "Family Performance".

June 28 – July 2: Children's Cultures from Around the World: ages 3-5

Children's Marionette Theater: ages 6-10

Children's Cultures from Around the World: Irish, Italian, Spanish, The campers will experience a variety of cultures with the geography of Europe being the common factor. We will invite dancers, sample food, create art, and make historical artifacts. We will learn the geography and practice our Italian and Spanish.

Children's Marionette Theater: A member of the Central Florida Puppet Guild will join us for this exciting week of camp. We will explore the history behind the world of Puppetry Arts. The campers will create with mixed media to produce their own puppets. We will explore literature with puppets. The teacher will share her collection of marionettes with the children. We will sing and create. The campers will create a script and perform on Friday.

July 5 – July 9: Nature Study of the Florida Biome: Ages 3-5

Chess and Game Strategies: Ages 6-10

Nature: Campers will delve into the world of nature that surrounds them, the Florida Biome! These Nature Rangers will experience hands-on lessons with the plant, water cycle and amazing animal life. Experiments and building simple models will help us gain understanding. An on-site guest from the Audubon Society Birds of Prey exhibit will wrap up the week.

Chess: Chessmaster Steven Vigil, a certified USCF Coach, will present the history, stories and strategies of the game. We will develop and fine-tune our personal strategies. The children will compete daily and at the end of the week we will celebrate with a tournament.

July 12 – July 16: Art Studio: ages 3-5

Expanded Mixed Media: ages 6-10

Art Studio: We will explore two artists this week. Your child will experiment, explore and create with a variety of mediums and techniques. On Friday, we will celebrate with an ice cream social and art exhibit.

Expanded Mixed Media: The children will experience a studio where imagination comes alive. Artists explore self-expression through energetic projects. We will enjoy a full spectrum of drawing (charcoal and pencil), and painting (tempera and acrylic). Campers will create a final masterpiece on canvas. Parents are invited to attend the art exhibition on Friday.

July 19-23rd: Earth Science: ages 3-5

Astronomy: ages 6-10

Earth Science: Biosphere Study: The study of our earth - the Biosphere. Experiments will start off the week; earthquakes, layers of the earth, geography and plate tectonics are just a few of the topics. We will learn from models and hands-on science to have fun learning about the planet we call home.

Astronomy: Blast off into Outer Space! The Astronomy curriculum will include space exploration, phases of the moon, constellations, planets, layers of the atmosphere and much more! We will create simple models of the earth and solar system, learning the history of Astronomy and how Ancient civilizations tried to unlock its many mysteries.
